## **Daventry Town Council Star Council Awards**

The Star Council Awards deadline for nominations is 18<sup>th</sup> August 2018.

### **Nomination submission**

*Section 17 of the Crime & Disorder Act 1998 requires councils to consider crime and disorder in the exercise of their duties, activities and decision-making. Reducing crime and disorder (and the fear of it) is the key objective of this legislation. In recent years of austerity, it has been easier for authorities to tighten their belt as they focus on budgetary output rather than societal outcomes.*

*It is within these contexts, conversely, that Daventry Town Council (DTC) has, in the past six years, transformed itself from a 'Christmas Lights & Hanging Baskets' Authority to one which now has a meaningful, ambitious and creative agenda to work for a safer Daventry, in a way which is possibly unprecedented in the country. When financial crisis meant that another authority could no longer financially support the town's innovative CCTV system, DTC devised and implemented a scheme to adopt the existing technology and hardware to keep the town's cameras working and monitored and transmitted to police headquarters. DTC has since developed and transformed this system, allowing greater coverage and responsive supporting schemes like the Town's Pubwatch, and developing its own 'Businesses Together' Radio scheme, where local retailers and traders are supplied with a radio giving them direct links to the CCTV control room and allowing them to effectively communicate cross-lateral issues, such as crime and anti-social behaviour.*

*DTC has recently embraced the Police & Crime Commissioner's scheme for communities which wish to enhance the policing footprint 'walking' to a more local agenda, by sponsorship of its own PCSO, increasing Police visibility, accessibility and engagement by around one-third. DTC has further enhanced the town community safety infrastructure by implementing a Community Ranger Service. These commitments of finance, ideology and officer support (with a small team of four officers) all place the council well in being able to evidence how it plays a key role in keeping Daventry safe and, importantly, feeling safe. DTC also works cooperatively with the Local Authority's Community Safety Partnership to help deliver locally identified priorities.*

*DTC has adopted a collaborative and successful relationship with the Office of Police Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and the local policing team, which in turn, trusts the Council with briefings on sensitive matters and incidents including child abuse, murders, serious crimes and incidents, allowing councillors and officers to have the best possible understanding of crime and disorder. It is quoted by many as being a leading exemplar of how to bring s17 off the pages of the statute book into meaningful activity.*

### **Supporting Documentation**

#### **Endorsement statement for Daventry Town Council's approach to community safety**

*I have worked in Daventry District for over two years, having responsibility for partnerships for the last 18 months. During that period our partnership has become aware of, and concerned about the reduction in resource within Daventry town, in relation to areas such as policing, mental health, funding for voluntary sector organisations, etc.*

*Daventry Town is surrounded by a large rural area, which is predominantly wealthy. The issues within the town are very different to that rural area, and there are a couple of areas of intense deprivation (LSOAs in the top 10 % most deprived in the country).*

*Additionally, Daventry Town is affected by its proximity to the town of Northampton, with a population of almost a quarter of a million people and significant areas of deprivation. These facts, combined with an era of ever-*

*decreasing funding from government have led to our concerns about lack of resource, as the larger scale issues within Northampton tend to be a draw on available resources.*

*In relation to policing, this has led to a noticeable decline in visible policing in the town centre and nearby housing estates. We are convinced this has contributed to a rise in instances of Anti-social Behaviour in some parts of the town, as there has been very little visible deterrent.*

*To have Daventry Town Council taking on responsibility for meeting that gap has been most welcome. The introduction of a Community ranger and the sponsoring of a PCSO have made a dramatic change in visibility.*

*The Ranger and PCSO have been proactive in talking and listening to members of the public and are becoming well-known in the town, generating a feeling that there is a policing presence in the town, one that is very much a part of the community.*

#### **Endorsement statement for Daventry Town Council's approach to community safety**

*I have managed the Daventry District and South Northamptonshire Community Safety Partnership for nine years.*

*Recent changes to Northamptonshire's Policing model have meant a reduction in the size of the Neighbourhood Team as officers are moved to cover other duties; this has had a serious impact on visible Police presence in Daventry.*

*The Town Council's commitment to working as an active partner in the Community Safety Partnership is demonstrated by their introduction of a Community Ranger and sponsorship of a dedicated PCSO for the town. These two officers work closely with the CCTV control room and town centre radio system, which are also run by the Town Council, to provide a high level of visibility and reassurance, as well as a pro-active resource to address problem individuals and hot spot areas.*
